# **GROWTH PLANS**

Families Plus recently lead a collaborative grant application to the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) seeking funding for Delta County-wide systems of care programs for children living below the poverty line. Joining in the application were Delta County Public Schools, the Center for Mental Health, and Drug-Free Delta County. This RWJF call for grant proposals offered \$200,000 in grant monies if funded. The four local organizations serving children and families enthusiastically joined together to try to fund more coordinated programs to assist children in developing into healthy adults. Although the application was not among the 50 applications invited to compete further for the 20 grants to be funded throughout the United States, the coordinated efforts on the behalf of the vulnerable children in Delta County proved that the understanding, the energy and the commitment to the needs of these children is strong in Delta County. Delta County clearly cares about children! Systems-of-Care that coordinate help for these children community-wide are seen by many as the answer to success for these children.

# ELECTRONIC MEDICAL RECORDS HAVE ARRIVED FOR FAMILIES PLUS AND AREA MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONALS

Families Plus was recently awarded a \$19,000 technology grant by the Colorado Rural Health Care Grant Council to purchase and implement a complete system of electronic health record (EHR) keeping for the Families Plus mental health program. A state-of-the-art computer program will replace the current paper charts and records that are becoming outdated. Families Plus has currently exceeded storage capacity for the 60+ very large charts in their records department. The therapists who often are working out in the community has difficulty accessing the health information in these charts. The new system will transfer all these records into one electronic file where all information is accessible to therapist with security clearance and adequate privacy protections. In addition to having health information that can be used, the new EHR system will allow Families Plus therapists to communicate securely on-line with others also supporting the health of the children served.

In addition to moving Families Plus records into a state-of-the-art system, Families Plus will use their newfound expertise to assist any and all mental health care professionals in the area to explore and potentially implement their own electronic systems that will permit them to efficiently maintain records and bill for services.

It is with great appreciation to the COLORADO RURAL HEALTH CARE GRANT COUNCIL that Families Plus embarks on this most exciting upgrading effort.
